

Is Samsung Nexus 10 Becoming a Competitor of iPad Mini

While Apple has released a new iPad 4th generation called iPad mini, it is no longer the king of displays. Later Google announced the Samsung Nexus 10 with an extremely impressive 2560 x 1600 display. . The tablet is running Android 4.2. When the Nexus 10 hits the market, it may be the best Android tablet available.



The new Nexus 10 not only has a sharper display than the iPad mini, it also has a powerful Samsung Exynos 5 SoC. As for graphics, the Mail 604 GPU is nothing short of incredible. At every level, the Samsung Nexus 10 seems to raise the bar, even though we don't know everything about the hardware yet. As for the battery, it should provide about 9 hours of video playback on just one charge.



As far as the design, the tablet is plastic, and the plastic is "essential" to make the tablet thin and light, as well as allowing for a solid grip on the back so you can hold the tablet in one hand. The Nexus 10 will be 263.8 x 177.8 x 8.9 mm and just 603g, which makes it both thinner and lighter than the iPad mini.

The Google Nexus 10 or Samsung Nexus 10 will launch on November 13th exclusively in the Google Play Store in U.S., U.K., Australia, France, Germany, Spain, Canada and Japan. It will be \$399 for the 16GB model, and \$499 for 32GB. Nexus 10 is just \$399 for a 16GB model or \$499 for the 32GB variant. One shortcoming is that the Nexus 10 will not have an SD card slot, so the storage is what it is.

Android 4.2 on the Nexus 10 will see most of the same improvements as on the Nexus 4, along with support for HD magazines and multiple users (based on Google account login). This feature will be a huge blessing.

Ports for micro USB and micro HDMI, plus two NFC chips, indicate that Google and Samsung aren't cutting hardware corners here.

Of course, no matter how sweet the Nexus 10's hardware is, there's still the unpleasant fact of the severely limited Android tablet ecosystem. Will the Nexus 10 finally spur developers to catch up with the iPad for apps and games? Let's see it in the near future.
